Vukani-Ubuntu's Skills-Development Programmes enhance your company's BEE scorecard rating.

As a corporate sponsor, you can earn points on three elements of the scorecard:

Code 700 - Socio-Economic Development

Contributions to Vukani-Ubuntu qualify fully as a corporate social investment (CSI) and can therefore be counted towards the target of 1% of profit after tax or 0.125% of annual turnover spent on CSI.

Code 600 – Enterprise Development

Vukani-Ubuntu's "Small-Business Development Programme" includes training for entrepreneurs and their staff, mentoring, coaching and business linkages – all of which are recognized by the BEE Codes for scorecard purposes. You can choose to allocate the full value of your Vukani-Ubuntu sponsorship to enterprise development. Alternatively, you can split your contribution to Vukani-Ubuntu between Enterprise Development and CSI.

3. Pay less tax

Vukani-Ubuntu is registered with SARS as an 18(A) Public-Benefit Organisation (PBO) and contributions to Vukani-Ubuntu are tax-deductible. In effect, your money will go directly to skills development instead of to the tax man.

4. Raise your company profile

Committing to social and economic development makes good business sense.

It will build your brand among today's increasingly hard-to-please consumers and public at large. The Global Millennium Poll found that 67% of people believe that companies should go beyond their making profits, paying taxes and employing people. 
5. Grow your future employees


